## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE MAY/JUNE 2021

Hopefully, I can remember most of the discussion from our Annual Meeting on April 18. The meeting was our first since last September, and for those of you that were unable to attend I will try to pass on the why and how of what took place at the meeting.

First of all, I would like to thank Denis Yaworski for hosting the meeting on short notice and supplying the food and refreshments. I also want to thank the 35 members who attended the meeting. It is important that we have membership input to assist the officers and board in the decision-making of our chapter.

John Raymond said that we have the go-ahead at the Brooklyn Fairgrounds for our 2021 Truck Show. It looks like the State of Connecticut will be fully open and there was no reason to cancel our Truck Show because of Covid-19. I think the public is ready to get back to attending outdoor events, seeing friends and just getting back to the lifestyle we are used to.

One of the things that I talked about was a National Zoom Meeting that I attended on-line. The subject of the meeting was "How to have a successful Truck Show". There were about 12 Chapters attending this Zoom meeting. I listened for some time on what different chapters do to attract trucks and spectators to their Truck Shows. They talked about things they do for smaller children and to promote new membership. While they talked about all that they do, I wondered where they get the volunteers to do this. The one thing that wasn't mentioned was how many trucks they get at their shows. Finally, it was time for me to ask some questions. My first question was how many trucks do you get at your truck show? The first reply was, we get 12-15 trucks; another was they had as many as 125 and one of our New Jersey Chapters said they have had 200. Some of the Chapters have their shows at Truck Stops or truck related business that donate the use of their property. Some Chapters rely on truck related businesses to be sponsors for the show. Many Chapters do not charge admission for spectators or show trucks. These shows are 1-3 day shows. When I told them our Nutmeg Chapter Show has been known to draw 300 trucks, their question was how many days is the show? My reply was ONE day. I asked if they had Flea Markets at their shows and they said they were too much work. I asked if they had anything like our Toy Barn, and no one did anything like that. I asked what they did with the profits from their shows and some said perhaps a Christmas Party, or a donation someone having a rough time.

What did I learned from the "How to have a successful Truck Show" Zoom meeting? It seems that the Nutmeg Chapter is far above the rest when it comes to putting on a Truck Show! The Nutmeg Chapter already has a successful truck show because we are located in a part of the country that has a large number of antique trucks and people interested in them. Along with having a successful truck show, we need to pay for the fairgrounds, advertise the show, pay our other related bills and have money in a rainy day account in case we have a bad year. It takes Volunteers to plan the show, set-up, collect money, register trucks and clean-up when it is over. I would say the more successful your Truck Show is the more volunteers you need.

I want to thank the members who have contacted me since our meeting to help at our truck show. And to the members who came forward at the meeting, I want to say THANK YOU for volunteering to help at the show this year. Your coming forward convinced me that we should proceed with this year's show. We need the rest of the membership that wasn't at the meeting to come forward and volunteer so we can make this happen. It takes help to have a successful truck show.

We were overdue on our election of officers that normally would have taken place last November. While we had a slate of officers for some time, we just learned that Charlie Dainton could not be a candidate for the position of President. Charlie has some medical problems and will be having extensive surgery later this month. Taking this in to consideration, Charlie said he could not take on the President's position. We all wish him well with his surgery and are looking forward to a speedy recovery for him.

In order to proceed with our over-due election, I said I would stay in the position of President until after the Truck Show. This will get us through this year's Truck Show. I also announced my resignation effective July 31, 2021. Soon, the Board of Directors will have a meeting and deal with the vacancy of the President's position. The outcome of that meeting will be published in this Newsletter.

I would like to thank the Nutmeg members, officers and board members for the beautiful glass print of me and my Kenworth that they presented to me for my dedication to the Nutmeg Chapter. This will look great in my office!

We also need to thank the two members who retired from our Board of Directors. Jim Dowd, "JD" has been on the Board and has been a longtime volunteer at our annual Truck Show. JD was a familiar face at the truck gate as well as collecting from the spectators. JD seldom missed a meeting and shared his opinions on Chapter matters. Jon Yeomans has done everything at the Nutmeg Chapter at one time or another. He served as President of our Chapter for many years and helped his father when Peter was president. He also put in many hours assisting at the Truck Show in various capacities. Jon needs more hours in his day now with his growing family (1.5) children, and new job that requires traveling. Jon will still maintain our Facebook page. Thanks to these fine gentlemen, they have kept the Nutmeg Chapter moving ahead.



1934 GMC T-18 Maggie A. McCormick, Owner

This 1934 GMC T-18 rolled off the assembly line in 1934 and, except for a ten-year respite in a garage, has been rolling along ever since. Maggie reports that this truck was first used to transport workers for the Civil Conservation Corps Camps, then went onto transporting prisoners to work details in CT. Maggie spotted this truck in 1973 in a junk yard and she and her husband purchased it for \$50. The GMC was lovingly brought back to life and its life as a Hot Dog Vending Truck became reality. In late November 1973, Maggie drove this truck to its first day of work and has been dispensing Old Fashioned Hot Dogs since that day. You can see Maggie and her '34 GMC working Tuesday to Friday in East Hartford near Connecticut Boulevard and East River Drive. "Truly a Working Antique Truck".
