

Minutes of Nutmeg Chapter Meeting

May 15, 2022

Call to Order: Tom Bachand, Nutmeg Chapter President, called the meeting to order at 2:00 PM. This is the last meeting before the Brooklyn Show.

Opening:

The Meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Chapter President Tom Bachand. Tom expressed appreciation on behalf of the membership to Denis Yaworski for his generosity in welcoming us and hosting the meeting at the Haul of Fame Museum. Denis provided pizza, grinders, side dishes, beverages and desserts to the membership.

Attendance: There were 22 members present.

Secretary's Report:

A motion was made to accept the Secretary's Minutes of the March 20, 2022 meeting as they appeared in the previous Newsletter. The motion was seconded and the members voted unanimously to approve the Minutes.

Treasurer's Report: Tom for Kevin Bachand Reporting period March – April 2022.

A motion was made to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented. The motion was seconded and vote was unanimous to accept the report.

Membership Report:

Lance Dimock reported a membership count of 150. 42 members owe dues for 2022.

Recommendation: The Board of Directors recommended that if a member pays late dues by the June Brooklyn Show, then the member will continue to receive a Newsletter. Otherwise, the member will not receive a Newsletter.

Discussion: Dues currently are \$15.00 a year. The cost of a member's Newsletter is \$14.10 for 6 issues. There is no plan to raise dues.

ACTION: Members support the Board's recommendation to stop mailing Newsletters to delinquent members. The online Newsletter is available to one and all.

OLD/CONTINUING BUSINESS:

Newsletter: Donald Arnauckas, Editor

Don reported that he has purchased Forever stamps for the Newsletter in advance due to the July 2022 postage increase. He reminded members that the Newsletter submission date cutoff is May 31.

Website and Social Media:

Kathy Arnauckas and Jonathan Yeomans continue to update and oversee the Chapter Website. Kathy reported that there was a delay in posting to the website, but the issue was corrected in a timely fashion. Also, she noted that all submissions to the website must be sent to Kathy or Jon and they will forward the information to the webmaster for posting.

NEW BUSINESS: 2022 NUTMEG CHAPTER TRUCK SHOW: June 26, 2022

- 1) John Raymond has ordered the flyers, tee shirts and dash plaques featuring Lance & Lois Dimock's 1944 1-1/2 ton Ford.
- 2) The Show insurance and Fairgrounds lease paperwork filing is on track.
- 3) National ATHS did not include our poster in the Wheels of Time although it was submitted in January. In addition, Don and Tom made follow up reminder calls to National.
- 4) The Toy Barn: Maggie reported that 13 vendors have committed to booth space at this time. One vendor is renting two spaces.
- 5) Show/Donation Appreciation sign was designed by Harold, Patty and Tom and created by Choice One Graphics. The

sign will be displayed at the Spectator and Truck Gates.

- 6) Dash Plaques will not be distributed to the Flea Market vendors or the Toy Barn Vendors.
- 7) The "Join Us Flyers" to encourage new membership.
- 8) The East Woodstock Cornet Band:

Recommendation: During a lengthy discussion, the Board of Directors spoke of the rewarding relationship and history that the Nutmeg Chapter Show and Cornet Band have enjoyed for the past 25 years. It is with regret that the Board acknowledges that the club does not have the manpower to set up the stage for the 35 members to accommodate for space and weather protection. Therefore, the recommendation to the membership is that we will not have the traditional one hour presentation by the East Woodstock Cornet Band.

ACTION: Members agreed to accept the recommendation. A letter will be sent to Maxine Marcy.

- 9) DMV and State Police have been contacted and invited to set up a booth for the general public information.
- 10) Parking: The Boy Scouts and the Girl Scouts will help with the spectator parking.
- 11) Publicity: Tom will be on WINY June 16 @ 7:30 AM, a letter has been sent to Channel 3 requesting coverage, and an ad has been placed in the Villager.

- Thanks-Giving Dinner meeting caterers: Tom will contact Matthews Catering to check their availability, menu options, and cost. In 2021, the cost per person was \$26.00 and the Chapter subsidized the \$6.00 increase. It is uncertain if that will be possible in 2022.
- Harold announced that Chris Breault is looking for any history or information about Emile's 1927 Diamond T.
- Calvin noted that the Cornet Band 1931 Ford AA antique stage truck paint refresher project is on track for 2022.
- Members might consider advance planning for their antique trucks by signing titles or bills of sale to facilitate future ownership transfers.

NUTMEG CHAPTER MEMBER'S LAST RIDE



The Nutmeg Chapter extends its deepest sympathy to the family of long-time member, **Donald M. Prifti** who passed away on April 3, 2022 following surgery.

Don was born in Westfield, MA on July 31, 1941 he was the only son of the late Nuchi T. and Lillian K. Prifti. A lifelong Southwick resident, Don began his career at an early age working with his father at Prifti Motors and in 1981 Don took over the business. Don married once (after being engaged 4 times). Don and Nancy married in November 1975 and were inseparable. Nancy worked alongside Don every day answering phones both at home and at the garage. Together they enjoyed traveling to Jamaica, one of Don's favorite getaways.

Don was a genuine legend throughout the towing industry, working closely with the Southwick Police and Fire Department. As a courtesy, he offered no-charge towing to the town vehicles. Towing was his love and he often quoted someone "If you love what you do, you never work a day in your life."

His love of the towing business pushed into truck and trailer repairs, helping others find parts and helping to fix tow trucks. Prifti was the one to call in the surrounding Hill towns for recovery and towing. He worked with the MA State Police as Don knew the roads in and out of small towns. Tourists and truckers alike would stop at Prifti's for directions.

During his lifetime, he was a founding member of the Statewide Towing Association, helped at local tow shows, giving demonstrations and teaching classes. He was the Western MA director of STA and also a member of the CT Towing and Recovery Association and held various positions with each of these towing associations.

Don was also the President of the ATHS Pioneer Chapter for the last ten years, organizing antique truck shows in Granby, MA, then in Westfield Municipal Airport and recently hosted the White-Autocar Group from Minnesota. Don was always on hand with his golf cart to greet trucks from NY, NJ, NH, VT, and CT. He was also a member of the John Boyle O'Reilly Club and the Hampshire Deputy Sherriff's Department.

Don is survived by his wife, co-worker and caregiver, Nancy (Broz) Prifti and a host of cousins, a sister-in-law and nephews. Services were held in Southwick, MA on April 11. Memorial contributions in Don's memory may be made to the Southwick Animal Shelter, 11 Depot St., Southwick, MA

On a personal note, Don Prifti was a longtime member of our Nutmeg Chapter. Prifti Motors of Southwick, MA has been in business since 1947. From 1954 to 1978 they were an International Truck Dealer. They were also a Diamond T and Diamond-REO dealer. At one time they were a "parts only" Autocar Dealer. They always had a fleet of medium and heavy-duty wreckers that served Massachusetts and Connecticut, doing towing for State Police and local police departments. Don preferred to design and build his own wreckers and was quite proud of them. Don was in the process of liquidating his business when he passed away. Don was a legend in the towing business in our area.

Don was President of the ATHS Pioneer Chapter for many years. He was instrumental in the success of the ATHS National Convention at the Big E in Springfield, MA in 2012. Don, along with Jim Fenton and Arnold Briggs, was instrumental in convincing National that Springfield, MA was the place to have a record-breaking truck show. It was indeed a record show, even with rain most of the day on Saturday. It took an immense amount of work to plan and produce this show and Don was fully dedicated to it and put in countless hours working on this show. It is hoped that Don's family and friends will keep the Pioneer Valley Chapter alive and well in the future. His wife, Nancy always worked side by side with Don on all his projects. We know he will be sorely missed, but his legacy will live on for antique truck enthusiasts. Rest in Peace, Don.


