 - C. Tee Shirts:
 - ** The recommendation by the Board of Directors is to increase our sale price for the tee shirts from \$15.00 to \$20.00. to increase our profit from \$2.88 to \$7.88. Manufacturer cost for the shirts to be made is \$12.12. Discussion ensued. Motion was made and seconded, and the majority of members present voted for the tee shirt price increase. One member dissented. Based on majority rule, the motion will be carried to the action of raising the tee shirt price.
 - ** Betty Robertson asked for an increase in the number of larger sizes ordered as there is a demand for 1X, 2X, 3X sizes. Members agreed.
 - ** It is a close call to determine how many shirts to order without carrying them into the following year when they sell for a loss at \$8.00. It was recommended that the featured Show Truck Owner pre-order the number and sizes of the tee shirts he/she needs.
 - ** Dash plaques will continue to be given to the owner/operator of each show truck.
- 4. The 2023 Brooklyn Truck Show will be Sunday, June 25, 2023.
- The 2023 Show Truck will be the one nominated at this meeting:
 Rob Coutu's 1971 Chevy C60 Rollback carrying Rob's 1949 Diamond T 201 pick-up was nominated for 2023.







BROCKWAY MUSEUM, Cortland, NY

I would like to share some photos that I took at the 2022 Annual Brockway Show. Every year in August the Brockway Museum in Cortland, NY holds this show that usually takes place from Thursday thru Sunday. On Thursday it starts with a Brockway Ice Cream Cruise-in. Friday there is the "Huskie Drive" with many road worthy antique Brockway's touring the area around Cortland. Friday night is their Italian Dinner, followed by a Brockway Auction (parts and memorabilia) and a spectacular fireworks display. On Saturday there is a parade of Brockways from the Museum to Main Street in Homer, where the National Brockway Truck Show takes place. This year there were about 125 Brockways on display. The antique Brockways park on Main St. along with vendors, music and food. At 3:00 pm awards are given out at the Bandstand on the Village Green. Back at the Museum, a delicious BBQ Dinner finishes the day. On Sunday there is a pancake breakfast at the Museum.

A visit to the Brockway Museum is a worthwhile visit at any time. You can call 607 299-4185 or visit their web-site at www.brockwaytrucks.org for hours and information. The building was purchased in 2006 with a generous donation of \$375,000 by Peter Grimm. Peter, obviously is a Brockway Truck enthusiast and owns many antique Brockways. Many of the Brockways that are on display at the Museum are on loan and rotated so there is always something new to see. Many of the trucks displayed in the Museum have been restored, but there are also original trucks that show the scars of a rough life doing a job that had to be done. If these trucks could talk, they could tell some work stories about the tough drivers that drove them. The Museum outlines the history of Brockway over Many people have donated Brockway the vears. memorabilia that lines the walls the Museum and tells the Company's rich history. Visiting the Brockway Museum is a "must see" for any old truck enthusiast.


The Brockway Museum is part of "The Central New York Living History Center". At the same location there is a display of Ken Eaton's extensive military collection along with model trains and rail artifacts. The Tractors of Yesteryear building displays antique tractors, historic farming equipment and Grandma's kitchen and parlor. In the near future, the "Firehouse Museum" will be opening. It will be a two story building and will feature an antique fire pole, along with fire equipment and memorabilia and informational displays.
