2023 NUTMEG CHAPTER TRUCK SHOW: June 25, 2023

- 1. John Raymond informed those present that we are pretty much on track for the Show. The fairgrounds will be open by 1 PM on Saturday so we can start setting up for the show. Since the last meeting two members have indicated a desire to work at the show.
- 2. A question was asked about the cost of the T-shirts and John reminded us that the cost of the shirts have increased to \$18.05. Therefore, the cost to purchase is \$20 this year.
- 3. For those who can help with Set-Up on Saturday, we will begin at 1 PM.
- 4. The Show Flyers are available for distribution and members were encouraged to take some today.
- 5. Tom reported that Brooklyn Fairgrounds has our Certificate of Insurance from National ATHS in hand.
- 6. Maggie McCormick reported that she has heard from 15 Toy Barn vendors that plan to participate. Three spots are still available. The question of when the Toy Barn is open for vendors was clarified. Vendors are welcome to set-up on Saturday afternoon. However, the building is not locked and there is NO security overnight. The Fairground gates are closed, but John stated that there is no overnight security in the building.
- 7. Charlie Dainton, our Flea Market go-to person, said that the gentleman who assisted him last year on Sunday is not available this year. It is a busy area and he will need help on Sunday morning as the Flea Market vendors arrive early and one person cannot handle it alone. Someone will check with Jonathan Yeomans to see if he is available. The Chapter has received permission to define the Flea Market spots with paint and that will be done on Saturday. Anyone who can help Charlie either day is greatly appreciated. Contact Tom or John to help.
- 8. Harold said the Truck Registration is pretty well covered, but more assistance is always welcomed
- 9. Harold stated that he will supply 2 or 3 golf carts for use on show day.
