## Minutes of Nutmeg Chapter Meeting January 12, 2020

**Call to Order**: Donald Arnauckas, Nutmeg Chapter President, called the meeting to order at 1:50 PM **Opening**:

The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by the Chapter President. Don thanked Harold and Cynthia for once again hosting our January meeting and encouraged members to enjoy the delicious treats that they provided. It was an unusually warm January day and there were 25 members present as well as representatives from some of the charities that are being recognized today.

<u>A motion was made and seconded to change the Order of Business</u> in order to introduce the guests and to present the checks. The motion was seconded and the members voted unanimously to change the order. The following introductions were made:

- 1) Ann Miller, Executive Director of TEEG (Thompson Ecumenical Empowerment Group) talked about the small grassroots non-profit social service agency in North Grosvenordale, CT. The organization offers a hand up to serve the neighbors in need of Northeast Connecticut communities and she emphasized the value of the Food Pantry (Tom Bachand is a volunteer); the Pomfret Senior Center and the severity of the homelessness among the young. Our check for \$500. was gratefully accepted.
- 2) Penny Newbury, Dir. of Grants & Communications for Northeast CT ARC thanked us for our generous \$500 donation and told us of the 22 support groups that work with individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families in the Northeast corner of Connecticut to give these individuals quality life experiences including Special Olympics and job-related skills.
- 3) Ann Stoddard, Scout Master for the Pomfret Boy Scouts, accepted the check for \$750.00 in appreciation of the Scouts' work in the spectator lots with the car parking during our Show. Ann remarked that while the troop is small, they continue to provide quality activities for the Boy Scouts and our donation helps them achieve their goals.
- 4) Chapter member, Denis Yaworski with his grandson Byron Hale (Nutmeg Chapter's youngest member) thanked the Chapter for their always generous donation of \$1500. He stated that our donation helps immensely with the on-going expenses at the Haul of Fame Museum. Denis also noted that this past year three members of the Wednesday group had died. Cliff Williams, Kenny Swan and Roland Thompson had been part of the group for many years.

After the presentation of the checks, visitors were invited to remain for the meeting and to enjoy refreshments.

#### A motion was then made and seconded to resume the regular Order of Business.

A motion was made to accept the Secretary's Minutes of the November 10, 2019 as they appeared in the Newsletter. The motion was seconded and the members voted unanimously to approve the Minutes.

Tom stated that the Nutmeg Chapter is in good financial standing. Tom reported that the audit required to be filed with National ATHS had been completed. Don will review it and it will be mailed to National well before the January 31, 2020 deadline. Once National has the report filed, the Chapter will receive our Certificate of Insurance. (President Note: The Nutmeg Chapter has the Certificate of Insurance on file.) Tom's report was unanimously accepted by members present.

#### Membership Report: Thomas Bachand

Tom reported that we have 179 members. Dues are now payable for 2020. There are 55 to 60 who have not paid their dues for 2020 and they will receive reply envelopes in the next newsletter for this purpose. These reply envelopes have been helpful to members as a reminder that their membership dues are now payable.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

#### Website and Social Media:

As reported in past minutes, National ATHS is no longer supporting Chapter websites within the ATHS website. Harold Foskett and Tom Bachand have met with the company that maintains Harold's website and they, along with Jonathan Yeomans expect that the website will be up and running within a month. Harold had the website that is in the process of being developed up on his computer and members were invited to check it out today. Jonathan stated that links for the National ATHS website and Nutmeg Chapter Facebook will be incorporated into our website. The website will include the ATHS and Nutmeg Chapter logos. As soon as the details are available, they will be published in the newsletter.

Don thanked Harold, Tom and Jonathan for their efforts on behalf of the Chapter to bring the us up to speed on the Internet and thereby increase interest in antique trucks and our Chapter.

In the interest of having Trucks stay longer, there was a discussion about having a "door-prize" drawing at 1:30 for a gift card. Since we are short on help as it is, the idea was tabled for the 2020 Show.

<u>One Call Now program</u> Don briefly touched on the idea of instituting a One Call Now program that would help in notifying members of an event that is time-sensitive in a timely manner. Our "calling committee" is very outdated. In the event a meeting had to be cancelled or a death of a member, one call is made to the calling center and they automatically call those members who have agreed to be notified this way. Not every member has access to email and this would be a more efficient way to contact members when necessary. The fee is nominal and includes 12 notification calls a year.

This was tabled for future discussion.

#### Committee for long-range planning

Tom Bachand made a motion that was seconded, that Don should set up a committee to look into long range planning. At the present time, we need a Membership Chairperson and will need a slate of officers for November. Don will announce this in the next Newsletter.

He said, "the company is still in business but switched to making caskets." I said "Wow that's amazing!"
