














HAULING an annual 500,000 gallons of fuel oil to the summit of New Hampshire's 6500-foot Mt. Washington can't be considered a snap, no matter how you look at it. It must be done at night on a road that twists tortuously, with

one hairpin turn and switchback following closely on the heels of the last. Then too, there is the matter of grade; it averages 12%, with occasional stretches as steep as 32%. Finally, there are the wild winds which make the cloud-shrouded peak their special haunt. Month in and month out, the winds average 37 m.p.h. at all hours, and in every calendar month they exceed hurricane velocity—75 m.p.h.

It's no wonder this operation, known as the world's toughest truck run, is called "Operation Nightmare." There isn't an easy inch of the way. Each trip is a contest between the mantruck team and the wind, weather, roads and the mountain itself.

Total elapsed time for the 8-mile run is $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours. In this distance there is a 4700 foot change in elevation. Every foot is gravel, with skids and lack of traction accepted as a part of the scheme of things by the intrepid drivers who make the climb.

The Mt. Washington oil-lift started back in '54 when a new TV station was constructed atop the peak. It posed a problem—how to get the fuel oil up there to power the generator engines. That's where Merrill Transport Company of Portland, Maine came in.

Merrill had the reputation of being specialists in tough trucking jobs, so naturally they got first crack at tackling New

> England's dominating pinnacle. They met the challenge head on, tried the mountain's precipitous roads and found them no match for their veteran drivers and their Diamond T's. From that day on Merrill has been the carrier of the fuel that keeps the picture tubes glowing.

> Merrill's nerve wracking mountaineering job is even more vital now, for it is on top of frigid, wind-whipped Mt. Washington, in sub-zero temperatures that the Air Force conducts tests on jet engine efficiency. There, too, the Navy tries out new clothing designs and materials. The mountain's crown provides weather conditions comparable to those the two Services would encounter as a part of every day life

should an Arctic war ever have to be fought. The fuel Merrill hauls keeps these vital experiments going.

The push in aerodynamics continues with other 'new' trucks

wo other vehicle modifications, one from General Motors Corp.'s Detroit Diesel Allison Div. and one from Navistar International, represent the continuing interest by vehicle OEMs in performance improvements. Both are prototypes, and both are being kept relatively quiet, although DDA has put out one press release on its "Phantom" tractor-trailer, and Neil A. Springer, president of Navistar International Corp., did make a passing reference to one of his company's developments. Springer, speaking at a governmentindustry-labor workshop in Nevada in August, divulged that a new aerodynamically improved vehicle was under test in the Southwest. One key benefit of the new design had already become apparent before the formal tests began, he said. "We've come to believe that the significant gains in suppressing splash and spray on heavy vehicles will come from aerodynamic design, and not from add-ons." Navistar's own drivers, he said, in delivering the prototype to the test area, spotted clearly noticeable reductions in splash and spray

when the prototype ran through heavy rainstorms. "We're only beginning to look at it," he said, "but so far it's very promising."

Detroit Diesel, while reluctant to say a whole lot more about its concept vehicle, has announced a fuel-efficiency test in which its futuristic tractor-trailer (see photo) produced a 7.84 mpg average on a 392-mi. trip through Michigan and Indiana, running against a conventional tractor with trailer that racked up 5.68 mpg. DDA acknowledged that the test was not an SAE Type II test, but one that it felt did represent the "real world." Both engines were 300-hp., and each carried 41,000 lb. of cargo. Both tractors had wind deflectors and side fairings, and the GM vehicle carries the division's DDEC electronic controls.

Detroit Diesel is continuing to test the vehicle "throughout the country in the widest possible range of terrain and weather," according to Al Kozel, manager of on-highway marketing.

Among other untypical aspects of the DDA prototype are sharply smaller radiator grille, shrouds on side panels, and extended cab fairings. In the prototype, small television cameras have been mounted on the cab fairings to monitor both sides of the vehicle. Viewing screens are mounted on the dash.

The vehicle was styled by Airodyne Industries Inc., Southfield, Mich.




