What are the duties of a Chapter President?

President - (As identified in the Bylaws) - "The President shall preside over all meetings and give direction to the Chapter. The President shall appoint the Chairman of all committees and serve ex-officio on all committees."

In addition, based on my experience, the President should expect to do the following:

- Coordinate board meetings as needed prior to full chapter business meetings
- •Maintain a mostly bi-partisan outlook and open minded approach to all business discussions during meetings. The President shall make decisions and recommendations that are in the best interest of the Chapter as a whole for the future health and growth of the Chapter.
- Record action items set during the Business Meetings and assign an active member for follow through with the action item.
- Deliver a President's Message to the Newsletter editor in a timely fashion as set forth by the newsletter editor.
- •Inspire volunteers to step up to help the Chapter with various tasks to further benefit Chapter activities.
- •Be in touch with ATHS National via email or phone with Barbara Sloan who is the Chapter Liaison. You will receive The Dispatch monthly which will keep you informed of what is happening at National.

On September 22 ATHS National had their first Leadership Zoom meeting. A Zoom meeting via the computer allows a group of people to talk and see each other in real time, similar to being in the same room. At this first meeting many of the officers and staff were there to answer questions from the Chapter leaders. Unfortunately many Chapters were not represented, but this did give the Chapters that were represented more opportunity to ask questions. Many good questions were presented and on behalf of our Nutmeg Chapter, I also asked some questions that our members have asked of me.

Some of the following are things that might be of interest to you:

- It is possible for a Chapter to request a change in the Chapter By-Laws. It would need to be presented to National. Keep in mind that National is a non-profit and has to abide by many rules and regulations which are based on U.S. Standards. A Chapter also has to abide by these rules. National has had legal advice on composing these By-Laws.
- To my surprise, many Chapters have members that do not speak well of the National staff and officers. Laurence was quite clear that in the past, membership had good reason to be dissatisfied with Kansas City. Many people and policies have changed in the last few years. National is trying to be "Membership Friendly". Maybe it is time to forget something that you disagreed with years ago and make your judgements based on recent happenings and focus on the mission ahead. I thought the Nutmeg Chapter was alone with some disagreement in how things were handled at the National level, but evidently we are not alone.
- In past I have spoken with Laurence about having a National Show in New England and I brought it up again. He explained that they have the USA divided by time-zones and the Lexington, KY show and next year's Harrisonburg, VA show are considered East Coast shows. I brought to their attention that a large part of the ATHS membership is from New England. It was suggested that I contact our Regional VP. I said we haven't had a Regional VP for many years. They said we need to have one for reasons like this and it needs to be someone who wants to do it. I told him that it has been said in the past that being a Regional VP was quite costly. Laurence said they are working on ways to help Regional VP's. National said it would need suggestions for places that could handle 1,000 plus trucks. Hosting Chapters would be expected to supply a large amount of volunteers and it would have to be profitable.
- National said they need to have more e-mail address to keep in contact with members. This seems to be a problem with many Chapters.
- When questioned about the virtual Show Time, they stated that the link would be available on the ATHS.org website on or about September 24 with 1455 trucks. Please note that you must log onto the website with your username and password. Also have your membership ID handy to log on.
- I contacted Barbara Sloan regarding the **DVD of the 2020 Show Time.** It should be available shortly. If you would like a copy of the DVD mailed to you, **you must call National at 816-891-9900 and request your copy.** Again, have your Membership ID handy.

The meeting lasted about an hour. I feel it was time well-spent. It was easier that calling or e-mailing various people with questions. With everyone together, it was beneficial to get different views on a particular subject. The next Leadership Zoom Meeting will be on Oct. 16. The topic will be Increasing Chapter Membership. Any and all officers are invited to join in.

Antique Truck Roadeo Held In South Boston

NEARLY 75 ANTIQUE TRUCKS from throughout New England converged on the Boston Athletic Club's spacious parking lot in South Boston on Sunday, September 19, for a full afternoon of fun and nostaglia for entire families. The event was the second annual Antique Truck Roadeo of the Antique Truck Club of New England, the largest chapter of the American Truck Historical Society.

The event was planned and carried out by Bill Semple, president of the Boston-based group, and his hardworking committee. While children and their parents, grandparents and greatgrandparents enjoyed the bright, sunny tail-end-of-summer day by browsing through the large display areas for both antique and contemporary trucks, by taking rides in the two old fire engines and a Rocky Mountain touring car provided by Boston's Museum of Transportation, and by picking through the trucking items for sale at the flea market, many of the drivers took their vintage power units over the roadeo course.

Instead of the traditional maneuvering and precision competition of a roadeo for modern trucks, contestants vied to see who could make the best tosses with bean bags and hoops in the shortest period of time, and who

could explode the largest number of irregularly-spaced balloons by running over them. A small jazz combo provided music for most of the afternoon, and was augmented by Essex Sound Systems—who, appropriately, brought an old Essex touring car with them.

Very much in evidence near the front gate was the ATHS, who had Roy Stewart, its president, and a number of the members of the national and local groups selling antique truck artifacts—and signing up a sizable number of new members. George Humphrey was in charge of judging the individual trucks in such categories as best unrestored, most unusual, oldest and farthest driven, while Ken Stonemetz made the roadeo competition awards at the end of the afternoon.

Pelletier Runs Doubles On The

Maine trucking family has innovated as it has refined its off-highway operations

DOUBLE BOTTOMS are rolling in increasing numbers through the central tier of northern New England—On Great Northern Paper's Golden Road out of Millinocket, Maine. At least two of the large trucking contractors who bring tree-length logs out of GNP'S two million acres of forest harvestlands in the Allagash Wilderness Area have developed and refined the use of doubles in off-highway operations, each using slightly different equipment.

Golden Road

"I have been a contract hauler for Great Northern Paper since 1958, when I started to haul eight-foot cordwood on a 10-wheeler," Gerald Pelletier, president of Gerald Pelletier, Inc., said. "We got into large trucking for them in 1972, shortly after the Golden Road was opened. We started with two trucks, and have grown to eight now, plus two cranes working in the woods, during the past 10 years!"

Gerald Pelletier, Inc., is a tightly knit family operation which started out of Fort Kent—and still calls the border town its home. Gerald, the father, supervises the operation. Rudy, one of his sons, assists his father in the office and shop and does some driving. Two other sons, Eldon

and Larry, run the clamshell log cranes in the woods, while Gary and LeRoy drive the big tractors for the company. A sixth son, Danny works as a driver for GNP.

Seven Mack DM-800 heavy duty conventional tractors with 375 Maxidyne engines are the primary power units fielded by Gerald Pelletier. One of them is equipped with front and rear drive for handling a doubles train. A brand new GMC with a 435 Detroit engine and all-wheel drive powers the second of the two trains run by Pelletier.


"We are operating only two trains at this time," Gerald continued. "The remainder of our units just pull a single 12-foot wide log bunk trailer for g.v.w.'s of between 175,000 and 200,000 pounds. We have seven Clarks, three Manacs, one Ranger, one Temisko and one Rodech for log trailers.

"We got into hauling doubles about 2½ years ago, when we started to work with Ray Vigue (NETW, June 1979, pages 58-59)," he continued. "It took a number of adjustments to assure us the equipment would work properly.

"We first had to rebuild the bunks on four of the Clarks, which were too stiff," he explained. "Then, we had to change from using a pintle hook to a special four-way fifth wheel to couple the dolly for the second trailer to the rear of the first one. This means there are three fifth wheels in a train—the one on the rear of the tractor, the one on the rear of the first trailer for the dolly to be attached to, and the one on the dolly to attach the second trailer to it!

"We needed the flexibility provided by all these fifth wheels, as well as a special articulated drawbar, to have our trains negotiate the rough and curving Golden Road, which is unpaved after the first 40 miles or so," Gerald added. "Naturally, we have to cut back a little on the sizes of the loads stacked on each trailer, but not that much. Finally, the speed of the full-wheel drive tractors have to be cut back to a 45 m.p.h. maximum, but that is all that Great Northern wants you to run anyway!

"The way I operate my equipment is an important part of my capacity," he emphasized. "My tractors never stop in the woods. Each trailer will drop an empty trailer and pick up a loaded one at the wye where the woods roads meet. I have two tractors which work exclusively in the

woods all the time. When the doubles are dropped, one tractor will take the lead trailer deeper into the woods—while the second trailer is coupled to the crane, which has a fifth wheel mounted on it, and moved into the woods!"

Gerald Pelletier, Inc., runs two hydraulic grapple cranes for loading the trailers at two woods sites. One is a brand new Tanguay, and the other is a Prentice.

"We also fabricated our own special landing gear to stabilize the loaded 12-foot wide log bunk trailers when they come out of the loading area and have to be dropped so a 'road tractor' can bring it out to Millinocket," a proud Gerald Pelletier added. "The regular landing gear alone would be too unstable with a loaded trailer, so we have placed four-inch reinforced square tubing inside the lead poles on each side of the log bunks. They weigh only about 50 pounds each, so they can be slid down by hand or pushed back up when they

are not needed. Pins hold them in place in each position.

"With these operating efficiencies and the two double bottoms, I feel we have saved the cost of at least two tractors and two drivers," Gerald asserted. "Naturally, we have a lot of rubber on the road with the trains. The tractor has a set of tandems, followed by a two-axle bogie under the rear of the lead trailer, a double axle dolly close behind it, and another double axle bogie on the rear of the second trailer.

"We were careful to insure that our equipment was up to handling the doubles when we placed both the first and second trains on the road," he continued. "Last year, we were operating one of the trains for a while with a tractor which did not have the front end drive. We started to get drivetrain and tire problems with it, so I said, 'Okay, boys, let's go back to running it single until our new all-wheel drive tractor arrives!""

Gerald Pelletier, Inc., has its own

shop building located alongside the Golden Road just outside of Millinocket. Most repairs are done there, except for engines and rear ends, which are usually sent to several shops in Bangor.

A different variation of handling doubles was observed briefly as operated by H.O. Bouchard, Inc., another trucker on the Golden Road (NETW, May 1976, pages 12-24). The frame of the lead trailer is extended back with four axles under it, and its top is dropped about sixinches—and the fifth wheel is mounted directly on its rear. While some operators question the stability of this arrangement, they also reported that at least one experimental three-trailer train was sent into the woods by Bouchard.

"We cannot see overloading our equipment and just creating more wear and cost to it," the father said. "The front wheel drive is what makes it with our trains. There is less tourque along the entire driveshaft!"

AMERICAN TRUCK HISTORICAL SOCIETY DIVISION/CHAPTER BYLAWS

Article 1. The **NAME** of this organization shall be the <u>Nutmeg Chapter</u> Division of the American Truck Historical Society (ATHS).

- Article 2. The **PURPOSE** of the Organization is dedicated to the collection and preservation of the dynamic history of trucks, the trucking industry, its pioneers, and other related industry fields. The purpose of this chapter/division shall be to carry out the objectives of the American Truck Historical Society.
- Article 3. **MEMBERSHIP** will be open to anyone who applies with payment of dues. Any person applying for membership must also be a member in good standing of American Truck Historical Society. Any member brought before a review committee appointed by the Chapter/Division President, and approved by the Board of Directors, may be expelled for endangering the welfare, interest, or character of the chapter/division by two-thirds vote of a majority at any scheduled membership meeting.
- Article 4. Chapter/Division **DUES**, as described in Standing Rules, shall be assessed on a calendar year basis. If initial dues are paid after August 1, payment may be pro-rated for the balance of the year.
- Article 5. **OFFICERS** of the Organization shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. (This may also read Secretary/Treasurer if one person serves as both and/or it may include a number of Directors.) The President should appoint a Historian and Newsletter Editor based on their ability, not by election. No person should be elected without prior consent.

Officers and Directors will be elected by the membership for one (1) or two (2) year terms in the following manner:

- A Nominating Committee, appointed by the President, will present a slate of Officers and Directors at the last business meeting preceding the annual meeting.
- Election to each office will take place at the first general meeting in the month of
 November designated as the annual meeting, with additional nominations to the recommended slate being accepted from the floor.
- c. A majority vote of those members-in-good-standing (paid up dues) will constitute the election.
- Article 6. **VACANCIES** of Officers or Board of Directors will be filled by appointment by the President, with the Board's approval, until such time that the next regularly scheduled election is held.
- Article 7. **DUTIES**. The President shall preside over all meetings and give direction to the chapter/division. The President shall appoint the Chairman of all committees and serve ex-officio on all committees.

The Vice-President shall preside over meetings in the absence of the President and fulfill any specific assignments the President may wish to make.

The Secretary shall present to the membership all correspondence that is received, take minutes at all meetings, and maintain the records of the Organization, including an active membership list.

The Treasurer shall account for all monies received in the name of the Organization. The Treasurer will pay all bills and present an accounting of all chapter/division financial activity at each business meeting. The Treasurer is responsible for sending an annual chapter/division financial statement, accompanied

by a copy of the chapter/division's income and expense journal, countersigned by all elected officers of the chapter/division, to ATHS headquarters to arrive no later than January 31 of the year following the activity being reported. Should a chapter/division dissolve, the chapter/division will be responsible for sending all outstanding chapter/division funds to ATHS headquarters following payment of all outstanding bills.

Directors shall participate in discussion, advise, and vote on policy as presented by the Officers of the Organization.

The Board of Directors shall be the elected Officers and Directors of the Organization. The President shall preside unless the Board of Directors has elected a Chairman. Meetings will be set by whoever presides over the Board.

Committees will be appointed by the President to serve as needed.

Article 8. **MEETINGS** shall be held at the frequency stated in standing rules with the first general meeting held in the month of <u>November</u>, designated as the Annual Meeting where an election of officers will take place if so warranted for that year. A quorum must be present to conduct the business of the chapter/division. Special meetings may be called following a petition of at least five members and approval by a majority of Officers and Directors.

Article 9. WRITTEN or printed NOTICE of any proposed BYLAW AMENDMENT or

SPECIAL MEETING stating the place, day, and hour of any meeting of members shall be sent by mail to each member entitled to vote at such meeting not less than ten (10) days nor more than thirty (30) days before the meeting date. The notice shall state the purpose or purposes for which it has been called, and discussions at such meetings will be confined to the purpose stated therein and matters incidental thereto. Notice will be deemed delivered if no undelivered notice is received from the recipients email server, addressed to the last recorded email address for each member as noted in chapter/division records.

Article 10. If for any reason, the <u>Nutmeg Chapter</u> Division of ATHS must be dissolved; all monies held after the payment of all outstanding obligations will be forwarded to ATHS Headquarters.

Article 11. **RESTRICTIONS & DISSOLUTION** – Article XIV, Section 1, of the Bylaws of the American Truck Historical Society apply. A copy of the national bylaws shall be appended to and form a part of this organization's bylaws.

Article 12. **FINANCIAL REPORT** – In addition to the prescribed Annual Financial Report mentioned in Article 7, duties of the Treasurer, a current Financial Report will be prepared and signed by the outgoing elected officers and the newly elected officers following an election, which will serve as the official audit of funds for the outgoing and incoming officers.

Standing Rules

(May be changed following twenty (20) days written notice prior to any scheduled meeting provided a quorum is present and majority vote is cast.)

- a. Division dues shall be \$ 15.00 annually.
- b. Meetings will be held <u>Bi-Monthly</u> at a time and place designated herein or at the previous meeting. (Please choose one of the following options: monthly, bi-monthly, quarterly, or semi-annually)
- c. Quorum: 10 % of the chapter/division membership must be in attendance at a regular or special meeting to constitute a quorum (10% recommended).
- d. The organization will be governed by the latest edition of Robert's Rules of Order in elections and all issues not covered by these Bylaws or Standing Rules.

CHAPTER (DIVISION) BYLAWS



Article 1. AGREEMENT

Article 2. PURPOSE

- a) The **purpose** of the Society is dedicated to the collection and preservation of the dynamic history of trucks, the trucking industry, its pioneers, and other related industry fields.
- b) The **purpose** of this Chapter (Division) shall be to carry out the objectives of the American Truck Historical Society within its' geographical area.

Article 3. MEMBERSHIP

- a) Any person applying for **membership** to this Chapter (Division) must be a member in good standing of the American Truck Historical Society.
- b) Chapter (Division) **membership** is open to all ATHS members making application with the payment of dues.
- c) Any member brought before a review committee appointed by the Chapter (Division) President, and approved by the Chapter (Division) Board of Directors, may be expelled for endangering the welfare, interest, or character of the Chapter (Division) by two-thirds vote of a majority at any scheduled membership meeting.

Article 4. **DUES**

Chapter (Division) **dues**, as described in Standing Rules, shall be determined by the Chapter (Division) and assessed on a calendar year basis. Dues may be pro-rated after mid-year for new members.

Article 5. CHAPTER (DIVISION) BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS

- a) The Board of Directors shall normally be the elected Officers and Directors of the organization. Officers of the Chapter (Division) shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. (This may also read Secretary/Treasurer if one person serves as both).
- b) The Board of Directors and Officers have ultimate authority over running the Chapter (Division). Individual Officers and Directors (including the President and Chairman) shall have duties assigned by the Board as a whole.

- f) **Directors and Officers** will be elected by the membership for one (1) (two (2) year term in the following manner:
 - 1. **Directors and Officers** must be Chapter (Division) members in good standing prior to being nominated for any position.
 - A Nominating Committee of Chapter (Division) non-Board members, appointed by the President, will present a slate of Officers and Directors at the last business meeting preceding the annual meeting.
 - 3. Election to each office will take place at the first general meeting in the month of NOVEMBER designated as the Annual Meeting, with additional nominations to the recommended slate being accepted from the floor.
 - 4. A Quorum of those members-in-good-standing (paid up dues) present will constitute the election.
- g) Committees will be appointed by the President to serve as needed.

Article 6. VACANCIES

Vacancies of the Board of Directors and Officers will be filled by appointment by the President, with the Board of Directors approval, until such time the next regularly scheduled election is held.

Article 7. **DUTIES.**

- a) The President* shall preside over all meetings and give direction to the Chapter (Division). The President shall appoint the Chairman of all committees and serve as an ex-officio member on all committees.
 - *unless the Board of Directors has elected a Chairman
- b) The Vice-President shall preside over meetings in the absence of the President and fulfill any specific assignments the President may wish to make.
- c) The Secretary shall present to the membership all correspondence that is received, take minutes at all meetings, and maintain the records of the Chapter (Division), including an active membership list.
- d) The Treasurer shall account for all monies received in the name of the Chapter (Division). The Treasurer will pay all bills and present an accounting of all Chapter (Division) financial activity at each business meeting. The Treasurer is responsible for sending an annual Chapter (Division) financial statement, accompanied by a copy of the Chapter's (Division's) income and expense journal, countersigned by all the elected Officers of the Chapter (Division), to ATHS Home Office to arrive no later than January 31 of the year following the activity being reported. Should a Chapter (Division) dissolve, that Chapter (Division) will be responsible for sending all remaining Chapter (Division) funds to ATHS Home Office following payment of all outstanding bills.

e) Elected Directors shall participate in discussion, advise, and vote on policy as presented by the Officers of the Chapter (Division).

Article 8. **MEETINGS**

Article 9. **NOTICE OF SPECIAL MEETINGS**

- a) **Notice** of any **Special Meeting** stating the place, day and hour of any meeting of members shall be sent by mail or email to each member entitled to vote at such meeting not less than ten (10) days nor more than thirty (30) days before the meeting date.
- b) The notice shall state the purpose(s) for which it has been called, and discussions at such meetings will be confined to the purpose(s) stated therein and only matters incidental thereto.
- c) Notice will be deemed delivered if:
 - a. posted prepaid in the appropriate mail service of that country addressed to last recorded address for each member as noted in Chapter (Division) records, or
 - b. if no undelivered notice is received from the recipients' email server, addressed to the last recorded email address for each member as noted in Chapter (Division) records.
- d) Mail or email delivery service preference shall be at the sole choice of the Chapter (Division) member.

Article 10. DISSOLUTION AND RESTRICTIONS

- a) If for any reason, the above referenced Chapter (Division) of ATHS must be dissolved, all monies held after the payment of all outstanding obligations will be forwarded to ATHS Home Office, as required by law.
- b) Article XIV, Section 1, of the Bylaws of the American Truck Historical Society apply.
- c) A copy of the ATHS Bylaws shall be appended to and form a part of this Chapter's (Division's) Bylaws.

Article 11. FINANCIAL REPORT

In addition to the prescribed **Annual Financial Report** mentioned in Article 7, Duties of the Treasurer, a current **Financial Report** will be prepared and signed by the outgoing elected officers and the newly elected officers following an election, which will serve as the official audit of funds for the outgoing and incoming officers.


Article 12 CHANGES
